SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

April 11, 2024 - 7:00 P.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Thursday, April 11, 2024, at 7:00 P.M. in Courtroom A of the Shelby County Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Robert Orman called the meeting to order. All those present recited the Pledge of Allegiance and the prayer was given by board member Brent Wallace.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Martin was absent.

Minutes for the March 14, 2024, board meeting were presented for approval. Williams made motion to approve the minutes. Firnhaber seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Orman announced a vacancy in County Board District #9 due to the resignation of Cody Brands.

Debbie Thompson, HR consultant with CIRMA insurance addressed the board about the need for an employee handbook for Shelby County. Thompson stated not having an employee handbook puts the county at a huge risk. The handbook can serve as a guidebook that sets clear expectations for employees. Thompson informed the board 7 new employment laws took effect on January 1, 2024, one of those being the Paid Leave for All Workers Act. This law comes with very stringent penalties if it is not followed. Thompson stated her services were included with the CIRMA contract. Thompson plans to work with the Legislative committee on a countywide employee handbook, as she feels this is best practice and can help protect the County from lawsuits.

EMA Director Scott McKee requested approval from the board for county membership to the Illinois Public Works Mutual Aid Network (IPWMAN). The costs are \$250 per year and in the event of a natural disaster or another event that overwhelmed the county resources as far as public works, the county would receive 5 free days of mutual aid from all over the State of Illinois. The IPWMAN has been in the works since 2018 and is slowly gaining membership. Clay, Effingham, and Lawrence County are surrounding counties that are members. This covers everything from small tools to semi-trucks to getting equipment in to assist the county with cleanup.

Firnhaber made motion to approve membership. Nelson seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Amling, Bennett, Boehm, Brown, Cole, Edwards, Firnhaber, Hardy, Keenan, Martz, Mayhall, McCormick, Morse, Nelson, Orman, Ross, Shuff, Tate, Wallace, and Williams. Nay: none.

A special use permit for liquor sales by the Tipsy Sipper was requested by No Bad Days Farms for their Rhythm and Blooms Festival to be held on Saturday, June 1, 2024, from 4:00 – 9:00 PM. This is an annual event for No Bad Days Farms. Approval allows the Chairman to issue the special use permit, which costs \$15.00. Cole made motion to approve the special use permit. McCormick seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Orman called for the Highway Engineer's report.

County Engineer Michael Tappendorf addressed the board to request approval for 3 resolutions. Tappendorf began his report by updating the board on what the department had been busy with. The new grader has been received and the employees are very happy with it. The maintenance crew has worked on reconstructing the lowboy trailer damaged by salt, done shoulder work in areas of the county, hauled rock, filled potholes, tested trucks, 50/50's on Prairie Township, culvert installations, signage, next week they will make 2200 tons of pugmill. The office team had also been busy looking into grants, bid lettings for 2 bridges, working on railroad crossings approaches, and working on design of the County Highway 5.

Tappendorf presented a resolution to award the low bid for guardrail replacement to Midwest Fence with their low bid of \$55,709. McCormick seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Amling, Bennett, Boehm, Brown, Cole, Edwards, Firnhaber, Hardy, Keenan, Martz, Mayhall, McCormick, Morse, Nelson, Orman, Ross, Shuff, Tate, Wallace, and Williams. Nay: none.

Brown made motion to approve the resolution to approve the low bid award (\$495,847) for removal and replacement of a bridge in Oconee Township (over TR 387 over Matney Branch) to Samron Midwest Contracting. This bridge is located on TR Wallace seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (20 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Amling, Bennett, Boehm, Brown, Cole, Edwards, Firnhaber, Hardy, Keenan, Martz, Mayhall, McCormick, Morse, Nelson, Orman, Ross, Shuff, Tate, Wallace, and Williams. Nay: none.

The final resolution presented for approval was to place no passing signage in the Findlay school zone on County Highway 3 west of Findlay. Brown made motion to approve the signage. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

<u>Shelby County Board Meeting</u> April 11, 2024

Tappendorf informed the board he would like to hire another maintenance worker, which he has discussed with the road and bridge committee. Tappendorf was told if he has enough money in the budget and the Highway budget would not require an amendment he could hire an additional maintenance employee.

Deferring from the agenda, Orman called on Cole to update the board on a farming alternative to a cash lease for the county farm. Cole informed the board she had spoken with Stu Fox, who has offered to farm the county farm for nothing, if the county will purchase the seed and chemicals. Fox would provide the equipment, the fuel, and the manpower at no costs to the county to plant the farm and harvest the crop.

Cole made motion to approve an Ordinance concerning the County Farm. Boehm seconded said motion. A lengthy discussion ensued. Various topic discussed were the initial creation of county poor farms by IL, the IL constitution, oath taken by elected officials, making money not being a public purpose, risks of planting a crop being a violation of the county investment policy, HB1076, statements by state legislature that despite the signage of this bill by the Governor, farming still had to meet a public purpose, Dillon's rule, and the counties not being authorized to run a business.

With the approval of Boehm who seconded, Cole pulled her motion to approve the Ordinance.

The Farm Committee will meet and discuss planting a cover crop of the county farm ground as a contingency plan.

Firnhaber made motion to approve the county hire a camera operator to live stream the meetings as there have been some technical issues with the camera. Edwards seconded said motion. Charles Baker from Mytec Solution was live streaming the meeting. Options were discussed such as allowing volunteers, the county hiring someone to do this, paying a stipend per meeting. Firnhaber's motion, with Edwards seconded passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Orman presented a timekeeping policy for approval. Williams made motion to approve the timekeeping policy. McCormick seconded said motion. Much discussion was also had about the timekeeping policy. Concerns have been expressed the equipment is not functioning properly, the system is not user friendly, is this a user problem or a software problem, the county would like to get away from paper timesheets, there is only so much time to process payroll, as the file has to be to the bank by 2:00 PM on Wednesday of payroll week, there is inconsistency in departments, if the employee and manager approve time, it will be correct. Williams stated he hoped to have someone from CIC and the department heads meet in early May to discuss and work on the time system issues that some are having.

Mayhall made motion to table the timekeeping policy. Cole seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (14 yes, 6 no – Bennett, Brown, Firnhaber, McCormick, Orman, and Wallace).

Chairman Orman called for committee reports.

Animal Control attended training in Peoria and all 3 employees passed the class and are in compliance with State and Federal guidelines.

The U of I extension office was able to donate 927 pounds of deer meat.

At a recent 911 meeting, the communication issues were discussed. The board is looking at unique and effective options and looking at ways to have a broader range of communication for less money.



Resolution No. 2024-25

A Resolution Authorizing Execution of The Illinois Public Works Mutual Aid Network (IPWMAN) Agreement

Whereas, the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, Article VII, Section 10, authorizes units of local government to contract or otherwise associate among themselves in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and

Whereas, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., provides that any power or powers, privileges, or authority exercised, or which may be exercised, by a unit of local government may be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other unit of local government; and

Whereas, Section 5 of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/5, provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with any one or more public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity, or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract is authorized by law to perform, provided that such contract shall be authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract; and,

Whereas, The County Board of Shelby County, Illinois has determined that it is in the best interests of Shelby County, Illinois and its residents to enter into an intergovernmental agreement to secure to each the benefits of mutual aid in public works, public works assistance, training, and other necessary functions to protect life and property and to mitigate, prepare, respond to, and recover from emergencies or disasters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Shelby County, Illinois pursuant to its home rule powers as follows:

- I. The County Board Chairman is authorized to execute, and the County Clerk is directed to attest to the agreement for participation in the Illinois Public Works Mutual Aid Network (IPWMAN).
- II. That the County Board, The Emergency Management Director, The County Highway Engineer, or the Sheriff of Shelby County is authorized to implement IPWMAN in conformance with it's terms.


In new business the committee decided to add crop cover as a contingency to cash lease if the lease agreement fails.

The minutes for the Regular meeting held February 5th were read by all. John made a motion to approve the minutes. It was second by Paul and was approved by all saying aye.

The January Treasurer's Report was read by all. Paul made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. It was second by John and approved by all saying aye.

Managers Report

All the trees have been cleared and the fence removed along the east side from the south end up to Ivan Baines property. There are still two holes to fill in where there were two burn piles that was dug out, for root balls and such, but has been to muddy to fill in. Talk to Jim Schwerman and he's going to have Jim Hampton come in and run a ripper over it to break it up, to get it ready to farm. Scott said he's still waiting on parts from Hali-Brite to fix the beacon, that it's still out. Reber Welding came out and repaired Steve's hangar door where Tim Swiney, who had just purchased Tyler Chamberlains plane, an Aeronica Champ, came out and tried propping it himself and it got away from him. Scott said Tim grabbed the right wing tip and it spun around running into Steve's hangar door barely missing his plane. Tim's plane will be out of service until he gets a new propeller and motor mount and has the engine check out. Tim's a new hangar renter since the plane was already based here and had a hangar.

Scott said he heard from the mowers and that they do plan on coming back this year to mow the grass strips but not sure when yet. Scott mentioned his son Lyle was out and together they rearranged the SRE building and put the snow plow away for the summer. They got the harrow out getting ready for the grass runways and also got the roller filled with water ready to roll them.

Lake Shelbyville Flying Club had two students solo that day, a father and son, Cory Wells and his son Ethan. Scott said the flying club has been a good thing for the airport so far. Scott mentions a person from Decatur has donated a RV6 Kit to the local EAA chapter and it will be discussed at the chapters monthly meeting the next evening. Scott said with that being said, at present it is on his trailer and will need some place to be stored and put together. A short discussion ensued on the matter.

Scott mentions the only thing left with the fence removal is the three gates and what to do with them. After some discussion it was decided that they be removed and possibly replaced with new gates, depending how the fence issue finalizes. Some discussion followed on the subject.

Scott also mentions the CAP folded, (Civil Air Patrol). They had two kids that aged out and didn't have enough to keep the club going.
