SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

July 13, 2016 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, July 13, 2016, at $9:00\,$ A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Pastor Pat Allin of the Moweaqua Methodist Church gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Bennet and Hunter were absent; Barr was tardy.

Minutes for the June 8, 2016 board meeting were presented for approval. Wetherell made motion to approve the minutes as presented. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no).

Jenny Biggs, WIU Peace Corps Fellow/AmeriCorps member, gave an update to the Board regarding recent activities of the Shelby County Partners. Biggs has served as an intern for the past 11 months assisting various communities involved with Shelby County Partners. Shelby County Partners is formed by members of the following Municipalities: Findlay, Windsor, Stewardson, Strasburg and Shelbyville. A farewell reception will be held for Biggs on July 27th. Tourism Director Freddie Fry said everyone was welcome to attend. Fry also stated Biggs had been a huge help to the Tourism office and would be greatly missed. Biggs was given a round of applause.

Chairman Cruitt requested approval from the Board to pay \$1,000 out of County Board dues to help offset Biggs' expenses. Williams made motion to approve the payment. Amling seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no). (Information about Shelby County Partners attached to these minutes).

Jessica Fox, Election Authority, addressed the board regarding the Report of the Selection of Election Judges for the 2016 – 2018 terms. Every two years, the board approves the proper ratio of persons to serve as Election Judges in each election precinct from certified lists which have been furnished by the Chairman of the County Central Committees. (See list of Election Judges to be commissioned in the County Clerk's office).

Wetherell made motion to approve the persons to serve as election judges for the 2016 – 2018 two-year terms as presented. Kearney seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Cruitt presented a request from County Clerk Jessica Fox to move the polling place for Pickaway Precinct from the Pickaway Township Shed to the Locust Grove Church at 2376 N 1300 East Rd., Assumption. Fox previously sent a letter to the County Board members explaining the reason for her request, some of which include indoor bathrooms and a much more comfortable work area for the Election Judges.

Cannon made motion to approve the polling place request change for Pickaway Precinct. Jordan seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no).

At this time, Chairman Cruitt provided the County Highway Engineer's report in Alan Spesard's absence. Cruitt reported with the passage of the "stopgap" Illinois budget, those jobs previously approved, Oconee Road, Rural Township Bridge and the Wood Street Bridge, would be able to proceed.

Prior to calling for committee reports, Chairman Cruitt informed the Board that beginning in August, only those committees with either something to act on, or something to update the Board about would need to give committee reports. Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes). Reports were given and items presented for follow-up or public awareness are as follows:

Law Enforcement Committee Chair Kearney reported the air conditioning had gone out in the front part of the Sheriff's office about 2 weeks ago. The cost to replace this A/C is estimated at \$15,000.

Shelby County Partners, Communities Working Together

Shelby County Partners, a collaboration of five communities surrounding Lake Shelbyville, "is a likeminded group that wants to see Shelby County businesses, schools, nonprofit groups, and especially its people achieve goals that better our communities and benefit our families now and for future generations," states Nate Wascher, president of the C.O.W.S. group in Stewardson.

The Shelby County Partners are made up of community members from the groups F.L.I.P. in Findlay, C.O.W.S. in Stewardson, S.C.A.N. in Strasburg, W.H.A.T. in Windsor, and various representatives from Shelbyville. These communities have been through the MAPPING Program (Management and Planning Programs Involving Nonmetropolitan Groups) provided by the Illinois Institute for Rural Affairs. The leaders of this program encouraged residents to identify high priority goals that would benefit their towns, as well as strategies and projects to achieve their desired results.

After experiencing positive results from the MAPPING process in their individual towns, the five communities decided to form a group known as the Shelby County Partners in order to identify goals that would benefit the county. Some of these goals include looking at ways to increase access to broadband for both residents and tourists, promoting community development, improving volunteer management, and increasing the awareness of options available to tourists.

Marcia Johnson, from the group F.L.I.P. in Findlay, shared that, "Shelby County Partners is a way for the communities in the county to work together toward larger goals which individual towns might not be able to accomplish. Also, communities can find inspiration and strength by sharing successes and working together."

Shelby County Partners is also a way for the communities involved to share about their local attractions, and encourage neighboring communities to check out their businesses and events. Freddie Fry, director of the Shelby County Office of Tourism, states, "We know the value of visitor dollars spent in our area, but as we travel to each other's communities, we are finding new services and products that let us leave more of our own dollars in Shelby County."

The main goal of the Shelby County Partners is to work on various projects that will have positive impacts in Shelby County. This group meets monthly to discuss ways in which they can collaborate on promoting efforts of community and economic development throughout the county.

Every two years, the County Board approves the proper ratio of persons to serve as election judges in each election precinct from the certified lists which have been furnished by the Chairmen of the County Central Committees. Motion and vote required.

The number of votes cast for Governor in the last three Governor elections determines the ratio of Democratic and Republican judges in each precinct. Based upon those numbers, the ratio of three Republican judges and two Democratic judges will be used in all 33 precincts.


Old Business

Sheriff Koonce reported the Air Conditioner that controls the front office has gone out as was obvious by the 90 degree room the Committee was meeting in. A new one has been ordered and will be installed in 2 weeks. The Sheriff's Budget is able to absorb the expense at this time.

Maintenance has taken place on the Detention Center building recently. Broken brick has been replaced tuck pointing of the mortar and weather sealing of the building was conducted.

The panic alarm system for the Court House Offices was recently struck by Lighting and has malfunctioned. We are currently waiting on replacement components at a unknown cost at this time. The Counties Insurance Company has been notified.

Undersheriff McCall reported continued work is taking place on the Detention Centers PREA Policy. (Prison Rape Elimination Act). This act is a federally mandated compliance standard for all Jails in the United States.

8 new Mobil Radar units for the Squad Cars and one Radar Trailer has been purchased for the Sheriff's Office. The 8 Mobil unis will replace aging and malfunctioning units in the cars. The Radar Trailer will used throughout the county at special events and at public request to slow traffic down in targeted areas. All of the units were purchased from the DUI Equipment fund at no expense to tax payers, or the operating budget of the Sheriff's Office.

The 911 merger with Christian County was discussed including the continued need for funds to upgrade equipment and Computer Software that is not covered by the State wide 911 grant. Options for funding the project was discussed, as money in the current operating budget it not sufficient to cover the expenditure.




