SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

July 10, 2019 - 9:00 A.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Wednesday, July 10, 2019, at 9:00 A.M. at the Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman David Cruitt called the meeting to order. Board member Dale Wetherell gave the prayer and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Behl was absent.

Minutes for the June 12, 2018 board meeting were presented for approval. Williams made motion to approve the minutes as presented. Hayden seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, o no).

Upon recommendation by the Republican Central Committee, Chairman Cruitt requested the appointment of Earl D. Baker to Shelby County Board District #4 to fill the vacancy created by the death of Rob Amling.

Bennett made motion to approve the appointment of Baker. Patterson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no).

Clerk Fox administered the Oath to Mr. Baker and he took his seat on the Board.

Upon recommendation by the Democratic Central Committee, Chairman Cruitt requested the appointment of Robyn Perry to Shelby County Board of Review District #1 to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Brenda Brooks. Perry was not in attendance. Clerk Fox will swear her in at a later date.

Cannon made motion to approve the appointment of Perry. Mulholland seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

At this time, Chairman Cruitt called for the Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, requested approval from the board for 2 resolutions. Spesard presented a resolution allowing the use of Motor Fuel Tax dollars on the Cowden-Herrick road project that will ultimately be paid for with the former \$514,000 in revolving loan fund monies that were returned to the State. Shelby County was able to get these funds back in the form of a grant to pay for this project.

Bennett made motion to approve the resolution. Patterson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Spesard next presented a resolution giving the road and bridge committee authority to award the bid on July 30, 2019 at the opening to be held at the County Highway Department for the Cowden-Herrick road project.

Barr made motion to approve the resolution. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no).

Spesard announced the County has been awarded a \$90,000 grant for township culvert assessment. Each Highway Commissioner has the option to participate in this culvert assessment and is required to pay 20% of the costs. The firm hired to do the assessment can put the township culverts in to a GIS program and also inform the townships which culverts need to be replaced.

Continuing with updates, Spesard reported the construction of the bridge in Richland Township has been completed and this bridge is now open. An IDOT final review is still pending, If punch list items are necessary, this bridge may be temporarily closed until those items are completed. The Windsor Bridge located 2 miles north of Windsor was bid on July 5^{th} . The low bid was submitted by Depew and Owen at \$224,688. Estimated costs were \$217,950. This bridge will be funded with 80% Federal funds. The bridge on the Ash Grove/Big Spring Township line has been approved and will be bid on August 2, 2019 in Springfield. The Capital Bill has been signed by the Governor. The county's share of MFT will increase from \$373,000 to \$626,018 with the \$.19 gas tax increase. A 1.5 billion dollar road improvement bond is still pending. Spesard explained how road projects are chosen and how fuel bids are submitted.

Chairman Cruitt called for committee reports. Reports were given and items presented for follow-up are as follows: (Committee reports are attached to these minutes).

Ambulance Committee Chair Frank Mulholland stated the committee had met to review time between ambulance calls. The committee decided to make no changes to the current Ambulance policy.

Public Buildings Committee Chair Dale Wetherell informed the Board the work on the roof is expected to be done by July 31, 2019 according to the general contractor.

Shelby County Board Meeting July 10, 2019

Board member Barbara Bennett stated the UCCI conference will be held in Galena on July 21. It was recommended that those interested in attending do so, as this is a good educational conference.

There were no Chairman appointments or correspondence.

There was no public body comment and no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Metzger made motion to assess mileage and per diem for the July meetings, to pay the bills/payroll as approved by the committees and adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on August 14, 2019. Wetherell seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (19 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 9:25 A.M.





Dear Mr. Spesard, PE:

Thank you for your interest in the Statewide Planning & Research Program. The call for projects was developed to encourage implementation of the Statewide Long Range Transportation Plan, Asset Management, and Performance Based Program Development. It has been determined that your project, Shelby County GIS Initiative, meet these criteria and \$90,000 total cost and \$72,000 federal cost have been included in the 2020 SPR/PL Planning Work Program.

To move forward with the project, the agency must be in an agreement with the Department for this specific project. No work can begin before an agreement is fully executed.

Information provided during the application process will allow the Department to draft an agreement for local execution. This information will be reviewed by your IDOT project manager and they will follow up with any changes needed to the budget template provided. Once the budget template is completed, IDOT will send a Notice of State Award (NOSA) that will include specific conditions of the grant as identified through the Internal Control Questionnaire and Programmatic Risk Assessment that was completed as part of the application process. Once the NOSA is accepted by the local agency, the agreement will be drafted and sent to the project contact for local consideration and execution once it is prepared. At this time no action is needed to get the project started.

Once a fully executed agreement is in place, work can begin.



July 3rd 2019

Sheriff Koonce called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. with the following members of the committee present: Kay Kearney Gary Patterson and Bob Simpson Sheriff Koonce Undersheriff McCall served as secretary.

First on the agenda was discussion on where to hold the LEC meeting and if the Sheriff's Office is accessible to the public. It was decided by the committee that the Sheriff's Office is fully accessible to the public and there is no cause to change the location of the LEC meeting.

There have been two resignations from the Sheriff's Office those being Correctional Officer Matt Graham who has accepted a position as a full time Police Officer with the City of Windsor. And Correctional Officer Shana Jones whom resigned to spend more time with family. Both have been replaced with part time Corrections Officers already employed with the Sheriff's Office.

Discussion on the Budget was held with a request from the Committee of the Sheriff to resubmit a budget proposal before the next budget committee reflecting increases in Vehicle purchase, inmate medical, juvenile detention and payroll and other line item increases to encompass the hiring of 5 part-time corrections officers to full time.

New protocols for the handling of inmates and inmate documentation have been implemented by Judge Harlow and Undersheriff McCall. These new protocols are intended to increase the communication from the court system to the Sheriff's Office.

The Committee reviewed the expenditures and the meeting was adjourned.
