SHELBY COUNTY BOARD MEETING

April 8, 2021 - 7:00 P.M.

The Shelby County Board met on Thursday, April 8, 2021, at 7:00 P.M. in Courtroom A of the Shelby County Courthouse in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Chairman Bobby Orman called the meeting to order. Board member Don Tate gave the prayer, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Jessica Fox called the roll. Coffman was absent.

Minutes for the March 11, 2021 board meeting were presented for approval. Baker moved to approve the minutes. M. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

At this time Chairman Orman called for Public Body Comment.

Jeremy Williams stated he attended the April 5th meeting of the Shelbyville City Council. The City, a government entity who can lease farm ground, requires the lessee to pay the taxes on the farm ground which complies with the law. Williams expressed concerns about the public's right to free speech and the perceived threat that he had heard this employee had made to remove people from the board meeting. Williams felt this employee's behavior was unprofessional and should be dealt with by the Sheriff.

Chairman Orman addressed those in attendance by and informed the audience that the Courtroom was in use as a meeting room for County board meetings and the County Board Chairman oversees keeping order and maintaining that with discretion of the board.

There was no further Public body comment.

Chairman Orman announced a vacancy in Board of Review District #1 due to the resignation of Robyn Perry. The Democratic Central Committee will fill this vacancy.

Health Administrator Stephen Melega updated those in attendance on the recent vaccination clinic held in conjunction with the National Guard. Melega also informed the public that Shelbyville Walmart has the Johnson & Johnson vaccine and Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center would be offering a vaccination clinic with the National Guard on April 9th and April 10th. Melega stated variants of the virus have appeared in Macon County and the vaccines do show some effectiveness to the variants. Melega was thanked for his hard work and given a round of applause.

At this time, the Chairman called for the County Highway Engineer's report.

Alan Spesard, County Highway Engineer, presented the Highway Engineer's Report and requested approval from the Board for 4 petitions, 2 agreements and 2 resolutions. (All supportive documents are part of the minutes).

The first petition presented was from the Windsor Highway Commissioner to replace a culvert located 3.5 miles northwest of Windsor (1700N/2525E). Estimated costs are \$4,000 and will be split equally between the township and the county.

Drnjevic made motion to approve the petition. Gergeni seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The next petition was from the Prairie Highway Commissioner to replace a culvert 1 mile southeast of Strasburg(790N/2900E). Estimated costs are \$4,500 and will be split equally between the township and the county.

Slifer made motion to approve the petition. Tate seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The next petition was also from the Prairie Highway Commissioner to replace a box culvert with pipe. This is located 1.5 miles southwest of Stewardson (200N/2525E). Estimated costs are \$6,000 and will be split equally between the township and the county.

Shelby County Board Meeting April 8, 2021

Barr made motion to approve the petition. Slifer seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The final petition presented was from the Cold Spring Highway Commissioner to repair bridge 087-3382 located on the Cold Spring/Oconee Township line (550N/600E). The concrete piles on the bridge have suffered water damage. This bridge is located 3.5 miles east of Oconee. Estimated costs are \$25,000. Shelby County will pay 50% of the repair and Oconee and Cold Spring Townships will each pay 25%.

Baker made motion to approve the petition. B. Bennett seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Spesard next presented an engineering agreement with Gonzalez Companies LLC to provide the design to repair the bridge (087-3382) on the Cold Spring/Oconee Township line(550N/600E). IDOT, who inspects the bridges, states a structural engineer must design the repair. Estimated costs are \$3,750 and will be split equally between the townships.

Lines made motion to approve the agreement. Patterson seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Spesard informed the board he had not yet received the funding agreement for the Rose Township bridge (087-3135) replacement. This joint agreement is between the County and IDOT. Metzger made motion to table this agreement until the May meeting. Baker seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Spesard presented the funding resolution between Shelby County and IDOT for the Rose Township bridge (087-3135) replacement located at 1100N/1600E road in Shelbyville. This bridge replacement will be funded with 80% Federal funds, 16% State funds and the remaining 4% split between the County and the Township.

Patterson made motion to approve the resolution. Metzger seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

The final resolution presented was to request the purchase of a new dump truck to replace a 2000 model. The dump truck will take 6 – 8 months to arrive after it is ordered and has an estimated cost \$140,000. The money will be paid when the truck is delivered hopefully before winter. The Road and Bridge committee have reviewed this purchase and given their support. This vehicle will be purchased out of County Highway funds and not the General fund. The 2000 model Dump truck will be declared surplus property and will be sold after receipt of the new dump truck. This will occur in the next fiscal year budget. Spesard stated he will submit a proposed budget for the next fiscal year tomorrow to the County Clerk, which includes the purchase of the dump truck and additional budget to support over \$3 million in Grant projects and other projects. This will result in a much higher budget request than normal years. Spesard stated that the funds are available in the County Highway Department that supports the budget submission and is willing to explain his budget submission in detail to the County Board Executive Committee.

Simpson made motion to approve the purchase of a new dump truck. Barr seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (21 yes, 0 no). Aye: Baker, Bar, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Canaday, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Hite, Lenz, Lines, Metzger, Orman, Patterson, Pearcy, Pogue, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, Tate and Williams. Nay: none.

Continuing with updates, Spesard reported the closed bridge in Flat Branch will be bid on April 23 in Springfield. The Cowden- Herrick road project pre-job meeting will be held in the next few weeks. The bridge inspection on the west side of the County is ahead of schedule and will be completed this month. Nothing too significant has been found. A bridge in Shelbyville Township was closed recently due to the washout will be repaired by the Highway Commissioner so the road can be reopened. Chairman Orman thanked the Highway Department for putting cold patch in a culvert that had been replaced over by the old Fox-Prairie Golf Course recently.

<u>Shelby County Board Meeting</u> April 8, 2021

Treasurer Erica Firnhaber presented the expense/revenue and investment report. Discussion was held about the use of special funds and transparency in large purchases by department head and elected officials.

Hite made to approve the treasurer's report. Canaday seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Orman next requested approval from the board to sign the annual University of Illinois Extension agreement for \$73,000. Baker made motion to approve this agreement. Durbin seconded said motion, which passed by roll call vote (21 yes, 0 no). Aye: Baker, Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Canaday, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Hite, Lenz, Lines, Metzger, Orman, Patterson, Pearcy, Pogue, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, Tate and Williams. Nay: none.

Chairman Orman presented for approval a resolution which opposes SB1602, which would remove local control for zoning and land use. Support of this resolution means the county wants to keep local control. Simpson made motion to approve the resolution. M. Bennett seconded said, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Undersheriff Sean McQueen updated the board regarding the \$250,000 DECO grant and stated that grant was currently in a holding pattern. McQueen also informed the board that Health Administrator Melega was unable to use the 76,798 CURES funding for the Health Department. Melega has requested this money be turned over for public safety salaries in the Sheriff's Department. McQueen told any new board member needing an ID badge to contact the Sheriff's office.

Terry Metzger. Zoning Committee member addressed the board requesting approval for a resolution to appoint Bill Schmitz as the new Zoning Administrator to replace Gary Townsend who will be resigning on April 15. Schmitz will be paid \$18,000, work on a part-time basis, and start this position on April 19.

B. Bennett made motion to approve the appointment of Schmitz. Drnjevic seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Chairman Orman addressed the board regarding combining some of the committees. It was discussed the board needs policy and committee description. The Legislative committee will begin addressing the issue of defining committee responsibilities and developing more guidelines for the board. Orman encouraged members to reach out to him with their thoughts on this moving forward.

Board member Derek Pearcy has researched county board size across State of Illinois in preparation for reapportionment. By law, the board must decide by July 1, how many districts they will have and how many board members per district they will elect. Unfortunately, receiving recent census numbers has been delayed, as the county should have gotten those figures by now. Pearcy presented a handout he had prepared and if information to the board members so they can begin thinking about how Shelby County should move forward with reapportionment.

Chairman Orman called for committee reports. (Committee reports are attached to these minutes).

Purchasing committee member Lynn Williams stated neither purchasing nor the health board had a quorum, but all bills were reviewed and recommended for payment. Concerns were expressed about office heads not using the tax-exempt letter to get sale tax removed from purchases.

Farm committee chair Jesse Durbin informed the board that the committee met on March 30th. State's Attorney Nichole Kroncke explained the licensing and leasing agreements but is still waiting on the opinion from the Illinois Attorney General. The farm committee stated if there is no opinion received by June 1 the land will sit idle this year. Kroncke stated she had called the Opinions Bureau at the AG's office, but they would not commit to a deadline.

Shelby County Board Meeting April 8, 2021

Law Enforcement Chair Gary Patterson stated the jail had a capacity of 24-25 inmates daily and has a max capacity of 28. The Merit Commission will be using a company to assist with hiring and recruiting new officers for the Sheriff's office. Patterson stated he believes the county needs a competitive payroll and benefit package. The FOP Union contract currently has a residency requirement, and some believe this is keeping officers from working in Shelby County. The Sheriff's office has also contracted for 1 year with Lexipol to assist in writing policy, as well as advertise and recruit.

Legislative Chair Pat Lines reported he would plan on scheduling a meeting soon so the committee could begin defining the purpose of each committee and updating some rules for the county board by reviewing procedures from other counties.

Public Buildings Chair Don Tate stated the committee was waiting on more information regarding the concrete work around the Courthouse.

There were no chairman updates.

Continuing with Chairman appointments, Orman requested the following:

Bryon Coffman reappointed to the Cooperative Extension Committee. Motion by Canaday, seconded by Hite. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Jesse Durbin reappointed to the Cooperative Extension Committee. Motion by Metzger, seconded by B. Bennett. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Gary Gergeni reappointed to the Cooperative Extension committee. Motion by Lines, seconded by M. Bennett. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Ken Hoene reappointed as Shelbyville Fire Protection District Trustee. Motion by Metzger, seconded by Durbin. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Paul Bennett appointed as Shelbyville Fire Protection District Trustee. Motion by Simpson, seconded by Swits. Motion passed by voice vote (20 yes, 0 no, 1 present – B. Bennett).

Tim Uphoff appointed as Findlay Fire Protection District Trustee. Motion by Drnjevic, seconded by Tate. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Don Selby reappointed as Tower Hill Fire Protection District Trustee. Motion by Simpson, seconded by B. Bennett. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

Tom Cole reappointed as Windsor Fire Protection District Trustee. Motion by Gergeni, seconded by Lenz. Motion passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no).

There was no correspondence.

B. Bennett made motion to pay the monthly claims as reviewed by the committees. Lines seconded said motion which passed by roll call vote (21 yes, 0 no). Ayes: Baker, Barr, B. Bennett, M. Bennett, Canaday, Drnjevic, Durbin, Gergeni, Hite, Lenz, Lines, Metzger, Orman, Patterson, Pearcy, Pogue, Simpson, Slifer, Swits, Tate and Williams.

At this time, Chairman Orman called for Public Body Comment.

John Kraft from the Edgar County Watchdogs told the board they needed to have a written policy regarding credit card usage and tax exemption status and have department heads sign it.

Gary Lynch updated the board that the current rescue squad vehicle (Old's Bravada) was purchased with donations and the commander is supposed to pay for their own fuel. Lynch stated, in his opinion, a new vehicle for this purpose should also be purchased with donations and not taxpayer funds. Lynch also referenced some 9-1-1 issues and asked who served as representatives for Shelby County on the Christian-Shelby 9-1-1 Board.

Shelby County Board Meeting April 8, 2021

Kirk Allen, from the Edgar County Watchdogs told the Board the public aid committee was a committee that was required by law as a sounding board for Township Supervisor's for General Assistance appeals. This committee has not met in well over 25 years. Allen also questioned if the \$5,000 donation for Shop with a Cop had been presented to the County Treasury yet.

Other comments were made about the tax-exempt status, residency requirements for county employees(a county line rule instead of a response time rule), questions regarding the Cooperative Extension agreement, and the possibility of a seating chart so the public knows who the board members are.

There was no further business to come before the Shelby County Board.

Metzger made motion to adjourn until the next regular scheduled meeting to be held on May 13, 2021. Pogue seconded said motion, which passed by voice vote (21 yes, 0 no) and the meeting was adjourned at 9:23 PM.

Thank you for the plans, Mike. Based on my review of the plans, encasement is all that is needed for this; however, your office will need to acquire an IL licensed Structural Engineer to put the repair plans together, but the typical repair consist of:

- Chipping away all loose concrete
 Clean and coat any exposed reinforcement
 Install a new reinforcement cage around each pile needing to be re-encased
- 4) Make new encasement diameter +/-6" larger than existing encasement, so you can encapsulate good concrete above the spalled region. The new encasement can be square or round, whichever is easier/cheaper/desired.

Review of the repair plans is not required by our office, but if it is desired, we can take a look to see if the repair plans are adequate. 32

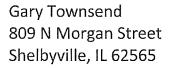
WHEREAS, SB1602 would relinquish local authority and the determination of needs specific to an area to others who do not reside in Shelby County;

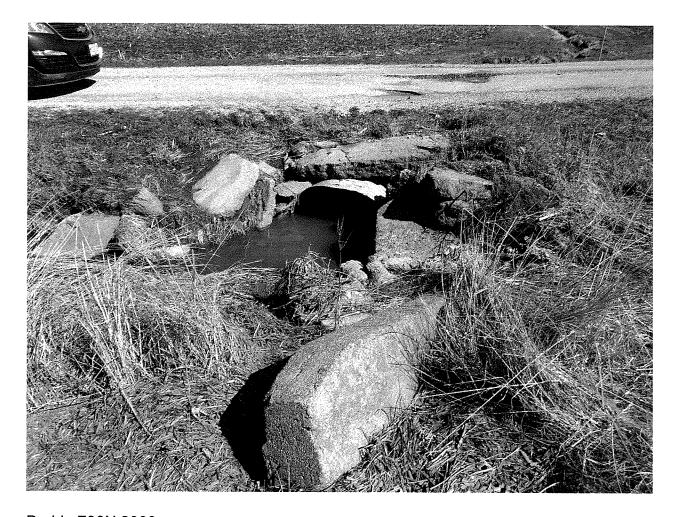

Commissioner Rick Brown calls the meeting to order.

Rick asks Jim to give his presentation. Jim starts first by introducing himself to the new county board members that join the commissioners at each monthly board meeting.

Jim said he was close to getting an agreement that the farm will operate from in 20-21. Jim continued saying that it would be very similar to the agreement that's being worked on for the county farm. Jim said much like the way it's been done in the past, except the lease with Stuart Fox would change to a custom lease instead of a cash rent lease like last year. Earl Baker mentions that the airport works under a different agreement and was sure the the airport could lease out ground. Jim asks Earl if he meant that the airport could continue with the same lease as last year and Earl said that's the way he understands it. Jim said that would be better for the airport if we could, especially with the hay crop.

Jim also said he found out there was a chance of getting the south sixteen acres tax exempt and with the help of Debbie Dunaway and her staff and others, was able to get the application in on the last day. Dereck asks about the ground and Jim, with the help of Scott, explained that it's the runway safe zone. Some discussion ensued on the issue. Scott mentions the 7 trees we had to cut down two years ago across the road was because they were protruding into the approach zone.

Jim said he sold about twenty-five bushel to the acre of the wheat crop at \$5.79, which was good at the time, but it is now at \$6.25 and might sell some more. Jim also said harvest price was \$4.50 last year and that's partly why he sold it. Jim said he had not sold any soy beans yet and explained why.

Scott asks Jim that if we were to plant corn along the west side of the runway again, would it cost us since this is our second year in hay. Jim mentions concern for our TIPS money. Some discussion ensued on the matter. Jim said we can't change this year but we can talk about it for 2022. Steve mentions the airport inspection will be coming up. Jim said the airport lost about \$10,000 in income when we had to switch away for row crops. Rick asks if there was anymore happening with the acquisition of the poor farm and Earl said that it didn't look like that was going to happen.

Scott asks Rick if he got the email that said we're not going to get any exception on the set back rules. Some discussion ensued on the issue.

Jim sums up and excuses himself.

The minutes were read by all. Jeff made a motion to approve the minutes. It was seconded by John and was approved by all saying aye.

The Treasurer's reports were read by all. Jeff made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Reports. It was seconded by John and approved by all saying aye.

Rick makes a motion to accept the bills as presented. Jeff seconded it and it was approved be all saying aye.

Managers Report

Scott said that NetJets did not show up as expected. The tree out front has been trimmed down 15 to 20 feet below the beacon now. Scott said there was at least seven or more taxiway lights out so there would be an invoice coming for that. Scott mentions getting a call from the Corvair Powered Aircraft people and they would like and plan to be here May 19th with Corvair powered aircraft and Corvair cars. They were going to be here last year but cancelled because of COVID.

Score said he was still moving a lot of aircraft thru the shop. Scott also said we're down to around one thousand gallon of fuel from the last load and sales should start to pick up with the weather warming up. Scott said two helicopters from the University of Dubuque stopped, One of them was a Jet Ranger and the other was an R44.

Scott mentions getting all the emails from the state on the runway maintenance project basically saying we can't local let it and work wouldn't start till August. Some discussion ensued on the issue. Steve said that Mike Dudas called him and said that Rick Borus had got all the entitlement monies straighten out to where it would be available when needed. Rick asks about the \$59,000 we had transferred from 2016 and Steve said that money is being included in the Maintenance project. A lengthy discussion ensued on the hangars and type doors to use and why the maintenance project is starting before the hangar project. Jeff mentions finding some info on the Corvair airplanes and read aloud from their website and that they planned to be here at the airport on or around May 21st. Jeff continued to read the blog and skipped down to where they mention talking to Scott and that he was very open to them coming here. Some discussion on the event ensued. - 5.Lexipol Policy Manual Assistance: The Merit Commission and Sheriff Dept have discussed and the Sheriff Dept and Committee agree that we need this service. Lexipol is a National Company and specialize in Public safety agencies. They will provide a current policy and training manual for our Law Enforcement and for our Correction Dept. They monitor and include all current laws and requirements. They Issue Daily Bulletins. The manual and bulletins are provided in a Digital platform and will be downloaded on all Computers at the Dept. All Employees will have the manual and bulletins at their work stations.
